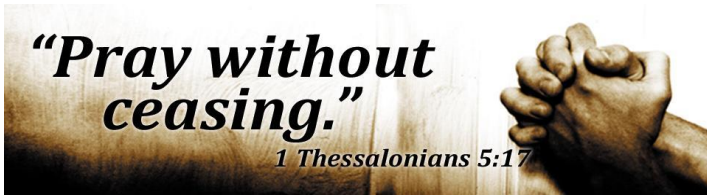

Exhibition of 150 Relics

At St. John the Evangelist Church

903 Giffard St. Whitby

Tuesday, June 13th 7:00 p.m. to 9:30 p.m.

The exposition involves some 150 relics, including those of St. Maria Goretti, St. Therese of Lisieux (the "Little Flower"), St. Francis of Assisi, St. Anthony of Padua, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Faustina Kowalska. The supreme highlight is one of the largest relics of the Church's claim to the True Cross in the world and a piece of the Veil that, according to sanctioned tradition, is believed to have belonged to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

The veneration of relics is a communion with the heroes of our Christian faith, asking for their powerful intercession. Many people have reported outstanding blessings and conversions through this ministry, and many have reported healings. Attendees are encouraged to bring their articles of devotion (such as rosaries, holy cards, etc.) and pictures of ill friends/family members which may be touched to the reliquaries as a means of intercessory prayer.

The ministry travels throughout North America by invitation. To date, it has been hosted in 48 US states, as well as in various countries throughout the world.

Fr. Carlos Martins, CC, will give a talk in the church at 7:00 p.m. explaining the significance of relics in the tradition of the Church. Then attendees will be able to visit the display of relics in the Parish Centre, until 9:30 p.m., at which time the display will be taken down and prepared for transportation to their next destination.
