

**Light Up the Church Building**

In a certain mountain village in Europe several centuries ago, a nobleman wondered what legacy he should leave to people in his town. At last he decided to build them a church building. No one saw the complete plans for the building until it was finished. When the people gathered, they marveled at its beauty and completeness. Then someone asked, “But where are the lamps? How will it be lighted?” The nobleman pointed to some brackets in the walls. Then he gave to each family a candle which they were to bring with them each time they came to worship. “Each time you are here the area where you are seated will be lighted,” the nobleman said. “Each time you are not here, that area will be dark. This is to remind you that whenever you fail to come to church, some part of God's house will be dark.”

Jesus said, “You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hid. No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house.” (Matt. 5:14-15). Attending all services of the church is letting your light shine -- after all you come to worship God and study His word -- then leave to serve.



**Knights Korner - Council 11729**

Celebrate Father McGivney on March 29<sup>th</sup>. Born in 1852, Michael McGivney was the son of an iron molder who worked at the local forge. However, a young Michael chose the priesthood and he was ordained in 1877 and assigned a parish in New Haven, Connecticut. The 1880's were a time when men would actually join non-Catholic groups to get a better job and, with hazardous work did not live the longest lives. Demonstrating great vision, Father McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus in 1882 with the aim of providing insurance for widows and today there are more than 14,000 Councils and over a million Catholic men are members. Father McGivney died in 1890, losing a battle with flu & pneumonia, and just a few days short of his 38<sup>th</sup> birthday.
