THE SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

John 16:12-15

Whatever the Father has is mine. The Spirit of truth will guide us. From Monday after Pentecost we return to the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. This Sunday and next Sunday, however, are designated as solemnities, special days that call our attention to central mysteries of our faith. Today, on the first Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This feast invites us to consider what we believe about God, who has revealed himself to us in the Trinity. The verses of today's Gospel come near the end of Jesus' long discourse at the Last Supper. In this section he focuses on the shape of the future, which will include Jesus' victory over the world that they will share in. The disciples of Jesus cannot know the future. Reading this passage on Trinity Sunday reinforces our understanding of the unity shared by the members of the Trinity. Although the idea of one God in three persons remains a mystery, we have the assurance that, as Jesus and the Father share all, Jesus and the Spirit share all.

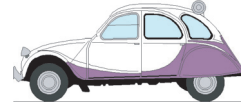
