On 8 December 2020 Pope Francis, in his Apostolic Letter "Patris corde" (With a Father's Heart) declared the Year of St. Joseph for the universal church in honour of him who was chosen by God to be a faithful spouse to the Blessed Virgin Mary and the foster Father of his only begotten son, a call he fulfilled with faith and total surrender to the will of God and not his own.

We are blessed to have him as the Patron Saint of Canada, a gift we share with the universal church since he is also the Patron Saint of the Universal Church declared by Pope Pius IX 150 years ago. There has been an enormous enthusiasm, soaking our hearts into a deeper understanding of the life of St. Joseph who occupies a special place in the hearts of the faithful.

Virtual Prayers, devotions, retreats, reflections, symbols and artwork have brought together the faithful from all the different parts of the world in spite of the limitations and restrictions caused by the pandemic, in order to be close to that Father's HEART.

As a parish we at Holy Redeemer Parish are blessed to have a new Statue of St. Joseph donated to us by the family of Michael Bridgeman who passed this past year and who had a great devotion to St. Joseph. On behalf of the parish community, I thank the Bridgeman family and ask for God's blessings upon them through the intercession of St. Joseph.

O our most mighty protector, be kind to us

shield, too, each one of us by your constant protection,

so that, supported by your example and your aid,

we may be able to live piously,


WHAT A BLESSED ORDINARINESS, THAT CAN BE SO FULL OF LOVE OF GOD.

QUICK OVER VIEW: LATEST RESTRICTIONS AND COMMUNION SERVICE

During this time, the capacity inside the church is restricted to 10 people only, including the celebrant and any others assisting. Due to the capacity restrictions, <u>public Masses must be temporarily cancelled</u>.

- Fr. Colman will celebrate private Mass daily for the intentions of parishioners and for those suffering from Covid-19.
- Our Church will remain open for private prayer on Mondays and Tuesdays from 9 am to 12 noon and 1 pm to 4 pm for the faithful.
- To receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, kindly call the parish office to book an appointment
- Holy Communion Services will take place on Sundays from 10 am to 12 noon, 1 pm to 3 pm and 4 pm to 6 pm, by pre-registration only, more

Lectio Divina with Cardinal Thomas Collins








